To support an environmental health and safety culture, my leadership team and I will


- Demonstrate that safety is a core value of Texas A&M University-Texarkana.
- Establish procedures and deploy resources in ways that encourage and enable safety.
- Incorporate efforts to foster a strong, positive safety culture, such that Texas A&M University-Texarkana is recognized by its peers as a leader in safety.

Safety is a shared responsibility, so it is vital that all within Texas A&M University-Texarkana take an active role in promoting a safe and healthy campus. Faculty and staff are integral to the process and are expected to:

- Be responsible for the safety of those under their supervision and oversight.
- Encourage anyone within their area to report problems, issues, or improvements without fear of reprisal.
- Serve as a role model and set a positive example for safety by following established safe work practices and implementing corrective actions brought to their attention.
- Stop an operation if it poses an imminent threat to people, the environment, or facilities.
- Report to the division head/Vice President any failure of persons to adhere to safety or regulator requirements.
- Complete safety training specific to the hazards of work.
- Wear personal protective equipment appropriate to potential hazards.
